

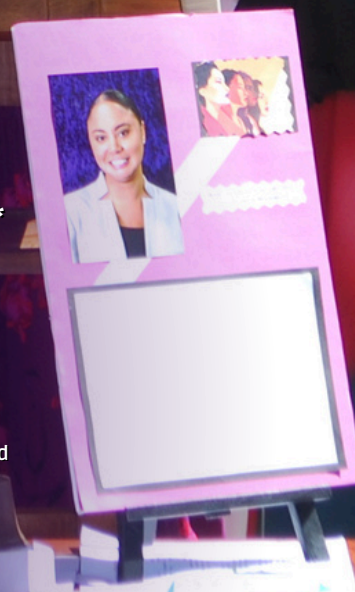

In addition to the foundational Job-Readiness and Empowerment Program, WE students and graduates are given access to a range of essential resources and support services.

These included ongoing career coaching, resume-building workshops, interview preparation, and personalized job search assistance
